

School success starts with attendance

Excel at Learning, Express their Talents and Care of Others

How can you help:

- Aim for 10 hours sleep a night for your child. This will make the following day at school easier for them to cope with.
- Make sure your child eats breakfast, it helps them stay alert at school.
- Help your child develop routines.
- Get their school bag ready the night before.
- Develop a night time routine that involves checking their homework, reading and bed
- Try and make sure that all medical/dental appointments are made for after school.
- Never take holidays during term time.
- If you know your child will be absent from school, write a note before the day of absence.
- If your child is ill, ring the school as soon as possible on the first day of absence.

Please note that time off before or after half term will not be authorised without medical evidence or leave of absence authorisation by a member of the Senior Leadership Team.
