Our values: Developing 'courage' in children







'Courage' was selected by parents, pupils and staff to be one of the nine values that we want to be instilled in the children during their time at Chase Bridge. Often, if you speak to young children about what courage means, or what being brave means, they will initially say 'it means you are not afraid'... this is completely understandable! When watching an example of someone being brave, it certainly often appears that way. Someone is doing something incredible, and in order to do this, they must not be afraid, right? Of course as adults, we know this isn't the case, and we know that courage isn't the absence of fear, but the ability to overcome it.

I'm not sure if Winston Churchill did actually say the quote that is attributed to him: 'Fear is a reaction, courage is a decision', but nonetheless it is a great one. When we teach courage at Chase Bridge, we teach children just this. Courage means you're a little afraid or worried to do something, but you think 'it will be OK' and do it anyway. This really helps children begin to understand that their emotions and feelings, including feeling angry or sad as well as scared, are completely normal. And that being worried doesn't mean you can't be brave as well! It also helps children begin to process these feelings and understand that emotions don't dictate how they act or the decisions they make, if they can learn to manage, and eventually, control them.
