

Start of the day

- ☐ Children will come into school at 8:45am.
- Children will wait in the Year 2 area in the back playground. When the classroom doors open, children will walk across the playground and into their classroom.
- Children in Birch will use the walkway by the side of the classrooms and enter through the back exit.
- ☐ If your child is late, they should go through the Office so they can be registered.

Home-learning

At Chase Bridge, we believe in setting meaningful and purposeful home-learning opportunities that helps children to consolidate the core skills they have learnt at school.

Year 2 home-learning expectations:

- Reading 15 minutes a day & comment in reading record
- Maths Shed set bi-weekly
- Spellings set once a week + a weekly spelling test
- Seesaw set bi-weekly to consolidate, revisit or preview core learning linked with a broad range of curriculum subjects.

These will be set and due on a Wednesday



Reading

The children will bring home two types of books which are changed once a week:

A reading practice book. This will be at the correct reading stage for your child. They should be able to read this fluently and independently.

A sharing book. Your child will not be able to read this on their own. This book is for you both to read and enjoy together.

Books will be collected in on Thursdays and new books given out on Fridays.

Seesaw is our primary platform for keeping in regular contact with you about your child's learning. If you haven't connected yet, please contact the office where they will be happy to send an invite request.

We will use Seesaw to:

set weekly learning tasks for children in Year 2 that focus on reinforcing learning from
the week, extending learning further, and/or previewing upcoming learning
enhance the learning at school
provide helpful announcements/reminders to families and children
inform families of the weekly learning and how they can support
celebrate awards and achievements
Build a strong partnership between home and school

Seesaw should <u>not</u> be used to send messages regarding incidents at school, concerns to raise, medical needs or absence requests. Messages are checked once a week and are used primarily for the teacher to contact parents to share learning celebrations and expectations; please email the info account if you wish to contact the teacher about any of the above.





















Move Up Morning
