Nurturing Talent

Having a talent or special interest is important to all children's sense of identity and self-esteem. It is an important element in the development of the whole child and their success. This is why Chase Bridge creates and provides rich opportunities through the taught curriculum and specialist teaching, for example our instrumental music tuition and extension mathematics groups, as well as through clubs and extracurricular activities such as our annual international rugby tournament.

All children have a special interest or ability that we want to nurture and

develop – or even help them find if it hasn't been discovered yet! We celebrate this and children will often feature in newsletters or the website. Children have opportunities to share their successes with the rest of the school and in class.

Our clubs programme is very popular and at different times of the year children have opportunities to play almost every type of sport (including rugby of course!), dance, drama, learn languages, and sing in our choirs, art, chess, gardening, book club... it is quite a list!

Caring for others

Chase Bridge is more than a place to learn: we recognise we are a community and the children are taught to care for and respect each other and the environment we work in.

We help all the children to develop a high standard of behaviour, a caring attitude and expect politeness and consideration towards others. We place great importance on the personal and social development of each child and strive to nurture skills that allow them to become caring, resourceful and independent young adults who recognise their own worth as well as that of others.

As the children grow up through the school they are given increased responsibility for work and their classrooms. This ranges from the youngest children being class helpers taking the letter tray to the office (with help!) to the oldest children organising their homework, going away on residential visits and being responsible for managing a budget in the children's School Council. This all helps to make sure that they are well prepared for their move to secondary school and beyond.
