Alongside youth service staff, a variety of local organisations delivered wellbeing workshops and

hosted stalls offering advice, education and links to wider community support.

#### **MHST** direct referrals for parents

The Mental Health Support Team (MHST) is a school-based service dedicated to supporting the emotional wellbeing of children, young people and parents in a variety of ways. We work with children and young people aged 5 to 18 who may be experiencing challenges with their emotional wellbeing or mental health. These difficulties are common and may include issues such as low mood, anxiety, or low self-esteem.

In primary schools, we also offer parents individual guided self-help sessions, based on cognitive behavioural therapy (CBT) principles. These sessions focus on supporting their child with anxiety or managing behaviours that may be challenging.

Parents are also able to self-refer their child to the MHST service, making it easier to access support when it's needed. Please have a look at the link below for more information. Parent self-referral e-leaflet
