"Know Yourself, Grow Yourself." It was a wonderful opportunity for children to reflect on who they are, what makes them happy, sad, and excited, and how understanding their emotions helps them grow.

Our Wellbeing Ambassadors led special lunchtime activities, encouraging their peers to explore their feelings and build resilience in a fun and supportive way. Some children also learned about the power of introspection, taking time to recognise their strengths, challenges, and personal growth.

We hope these important conversations continue at home, helping children develop self-awareness and confidence.

Check if Your Child is Eligible for Free School Meals!

Did you know that your child could be entitled to Free School Meals (FSM)? Many families are eligible but haven't applied - don't miss out on this valuable support!

Why Apply?

Save Money – A free, nutritious meal every school day.

Extra Funding for Your Child's School – Your application helps secure vital funding for your child's education.

More Benefits – Access to additional school support, including help with the cost of uniform, trips, and clubs.

Who Can Apply?

You may be eligible if you receive:

- 1. Universal Credit (with a household income of less than £7,400 per year after tax)
- 2. Income Support
- 3. Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- 4. Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- 5. Child Tax Credit (with an income below £16,190 and not receiving Working Tax Credit)
- 6. Other qualifying benefits

How to Apply

Applying is quick and easy! Simply scan the QR code and complete the online form in the attached poster. All applications are confidential.

Even if Your Child Prefers Packed Lunch...

By registering, you still help your child's school receive extra funding, so it's worth applying! We can also provide support with funding for uniforms, clubs, and trips.


Absence before/after school holidays
