PANTS Week

We had a fantastic week last week celebrating PANTS Week across the whole school! Reception enjoyed listening to the PANTS story in their assembly and children in Nursery and EYFS loved creating their own colourful PANTS posters — they even hung them up on the washing line for everyone to see!

KSI had lots of fun singing the PANTS song and we were thrilled to welcome a special visit from Pantosaurus himself on Wednesday. He enjoyed spending time with the children and even came along at pick-up to say hello to some of our parents.

The PANTS campaign, created by the NSPCC, helps children understand that their body belongs to them and that they have the right to say no and to speak out if anything ever makes them feel uncomfortable. It's an important part of our PSHE curriculum, teaching children about personal safety in a simple, age-appropriate and empowering way.
