Late Arrivals

Did you know that arriving late can affect your child's attendance?

Late Arrivals

5 minutes late = **3** days lost each year

10 minutes late = **6.5** days lost each year

15 minutes late = **10** days lost each year

20 minutes late = **13** days lost each year

30 minutes late = **19** days lost each year

What you can do:

- Have a regular routine for the start of each day.
- Help your child get their clothes and equipment ready before they go to bed.
- Set a reasonable bed time to make sure they get enough sleep.

If your child arrives late for class:

- They miss out on important learning, which could affect their achievement.
- This can cause anxiety and a pressure that is largely not the fault of the child.
- They don't have the social time to settle into class.
- It can be embarrassing for them.
- They may disrupt the learning of the rest of the class.

Children's Mental Health Week



Children's Mental Health Week takes place from **9th February**, with the national theme this year being "This Is My Place." This theme focuses on the importance of belonging, feeling safe, valued and accepted in the spaces that matter most to children and young people, such as home, school and the wider community. Having a strong sense of place can play an important role in supporting children's emotional wellbeing.

This year, we are supporting **Space2Grieve**, a local charity that provides free specialist support to children and young people who have experienced bereavement. The charity offers safe and supportive spaces where children can talk about their feelings, share experiences and receive guidance during challenging times.

The work of **Space2Grieve** links closely with the theme of *"This Is My Place,"* as it helps children find a place where they feel heard, understood and supported, particularly at times when they may feel most vulnerable.

Year 5 History workshop

Last Friday, Year 5 took part in an engaging history workshop exploring life in the early city of Baghdad. The session focused on why Baghdad became one of the most important cities in the world over a thousand years ago and what made it such a successful centre of trade, learning, and culture.

Pupils learned that Baghdad was carefully planned and built along the River Tigris, making it an ideal location for travel and trade. They discovered how goods, ideas, and people travelled from many different parts of the world into the city, helping it grow rich and influential. The children were particularly interested in finding out about the *House of Wisdom*, where scholars studied subjects such as maths, science, medicine, and astronomy.

Through a range of interactive activities, Year 5 explored how knowledge was shared and preserved in early Baghdad and how many important ideas from this time still influence the world today. The workshop helped pupils understand why historians describe Baghdad as a key centre of learning during the early medieval period and why it remains significant in world history.

Year 1 Toys workshop



Year 1 had a fantastic time today taking part in a toy workshop with the Chertsey Museum, learning all about toys from the past. The children enjoyed an engaging talk about old toys, explored how children used to play, and even made their own thaumatrope. They also had lots of fun playing with a selection of traditional indoor and outdoor toys. It was a wonderful hands-on experience that brought history to life!
